

## 8.06 PEDIATRIC CARDIAC ARREST: BRADYASYSTOLE AND PEA

<b>BLS Treatment</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• If HR &lt; 60, start CPR.</li><li>• <b>Oxygen</b> as indicated.</li><li>• Provide <b>Spinal Motion Restriction</b> as indicated or position of comfort as indicated.</li><li>• Appropriately splint suspected fractures/instability as indicated.</li><li>• Bandage wounds/control bleeding as indicated.</li></ul>
<b>ALS Treatment</b>
<b>Current American Heart Association Guidelines concerning Emergency Cardiac Care assessments and interventions shall always take precedence over local protocols when there is a conflict concerning techniques of resuscitation.</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Advanced airway if indicated.</li><li>• Establish IV/IO with <b>Normal Saline</b> TKO.</li><li>• <b>Normal Saline</b> bolus if hypovolemia suspected.</li><li>• <b>Epinephrine</b></li><li>• Provide grief support and referrals for on-site survivors as needed.</li></ul>
<b>Base Hospital Contact Criteria</b>
Termination of efforts.
