This Medical Directive builds upon MD 21-03 that implemented the blood product administration clinical procedure ( $\geq$  PL6 providers) in support of the blood product pilot program.

This Medical Directive adds blood product administration clinical procedure and calcium chloride to the Non-Traumatic Hypotension clinical guideline. This broadens blood product administration as a treatment option for non-traumatic hemorrhage, such as GI or OB/GYN bleeding as examples. Blood product administration was already listed in Trauma and Traumatic Cardiac Arrest clinical guidelines.
