



## ***KCEMS COVID-19 Update    March 20<sup>th</sup>, 2020 1700***

### **New Emergency Regional System Protocol:**

**There has been no change, however, messaging below is still considered relevant.**

There has been a new Regional protocol implemented today that all MCA's in the Region have adopted. The only change that affects agencies and providers within the KCEMS MCA is that now all responders must have a screening done prior to arriving at work and/or responding to calls. The minimum requirement for the screening is if a responder has a fever of 100.4°F, or 38°C, they will not be allowed to report for work. Some agencies are including a full screen, please check with your department's leadership for the current expectations.

### **PSAP & EMD Screening Process:**

No changes from previous update.

### **PPE Recommendations:**

**There has been no change, however, messaging below is still considered relevant.**

Due to the current climate it is important to have a high index of suspicion. If you are responding to a patient complaining of respiratory problems please ensure that you have the proper PPR with you and conduct your initial assessment from the recommended distance of at least 6 feet away. If you believe that the patient has the potential to be of risk for COVID-19 immediately don your PPE and then continue with your assessment and care of the patient.

By taking these steps you will significantly limit your potential exposure risk.

### **Expired PPE:**

**There has been no change, however, messaging below is still considered relevant.**

Some of the PPE (masks) being distributed show an expiration date in the past. The products have been stored in optimal conditions. Per the CDC, the masks are effective, and lots tested all met protection standards. The elastic in the bands does degrade over time. So, take a second to check the masks before application. If they look damaged, discolored or if the elastic is not springy, select another.

### **Droplet Precautions:**

**There has been no change to current droplet precaution processes as previously reported.** N-95's are still required when providing these types of procedures. (NebRx, CPAP, BVM) Please continue to discontinue nebulizer treatments prior to entering in healthcare facilities. Please also continue to contact ED's upon arrival with patients on CPAP to ensure staff is prepared in the assigned location before entering and then transition the patient to an NRB as ordered by the healthcare facility.

### **Hospital Notifications:**

**There has been no change from previous updates.** Please continue to notify ED's by both EMTrack and MedCom reports for **all screened positive patients regardless of chief complaint.** Reports should include all signs and symptoms that the patients are experiencing.



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Healthcare systems may begin to consolidate positive screened COVID-19 to one location. This at the specific direction of the receiving facilities.

### **Exposure Evaluation**

Please understand that some testing supplies are in shortage so testing is being prioritized. First responders are still being prioritized.

### **Hospital Visitations:**

There has been no change from previous update.

### **Patient Follow-ups:**

There has been no change from previous update. All confirmed positive patients will have direct follow up to agencies involved.

### **Required Certification Courses:**

There has been no change, however, messaging below is still considered relevant.

Effective immediately KCEMS has suspended recertification requirements of all required certification courses until October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020. This includes ACLS, PHTLS, PALS, PEPP, ect. Further information will be forth coming to all agency leadership.

### **Agency Leadership PPE Information:**

There has been no change from previous update.

Region 6 has received a shipment of PPE from the SNS. If your Life Support Agency is in need of supplies please follow this link and request the needed supplies. *This must be done daily to ensure that the requests are processed based on current supplies.*
